I am very passionate about the buildings and grounds and hope that the new team of Trustees can really make a difference. We have a team of five Trustees. Bill and Larry have both been Trustees for a while. Chloe joined at the same time as me and Harriet came on board earlier this year. Together, I think we will make a formidable team!

There is no doubt that the next 12 to 18 months are going to be a challenge. The Charity is in a very precarious financial position, and we need to work hard to change this to secure a long-term future for the buildings and grounds.

Ideally, the income from hirers would cover costs so that the Charity breaks even. Additional income from fund-raising events would go towards projects to improve the facilities for those who use them. Sadly, this is not currently the case. The Charity is **only** surviving because the fund-raising income tops-up that from hirers, but we are still not managing to breakeven. This leaves very little to spend on improving the facilities as our savings are reducing year upon year to bridge the gap that is left.

The building and grounds need significant work. We have limited savings that can be used for some of this but it is not sufficient to get the building in the shape that it needs to be in.

The good news is that we are welcoming new hirers, both regular and ad-hoc all the time and, local residents are starting to book the hall for more functions. As long as this continues, the future of the village hall looks brighter. However, there is a long way to go and very little time before our savings run out.
